PARTNER-PARENT

Purpose: To help small group leaders with outside events and to undergird them in order to promote success in the group.

Responsibilities: For parents to help a small group leader (maybe their child's leader), with tasks such as contacting students, organizing food for a party, a home for a sleepover, rides for a special event, television for a movie night, invite other adults to help with these events as needed. This parent is encouraged to check-in with the leader on a regular basis, to offer emotional support, especially through prayer.

SMALL GROUP CO-LEADER

Purpose: To serve as a leader for a small group of HS students to help them develop relationships of trust with other believers and to explore Scripture as it applies to life. The small group leaders are also the primary contacts between the student and the ministry.

Responsibilities: Attend High School Leader Team meetings. Invite students to your weekly small group meeting. Lead/teach/guide weekly meetings with students. Meet with students in non-group settings to facilitate discipleship. Plan one social/fun activity for your group a month. Attend High School Ministry events/retreats whenever possible.

WORSHIP TEAM MEMBER

Lead students in vibrant worship as they seek to follow Christ. Students need a worship experience that is as deep as the love of God we teach.

Responsibilities: Coordinate, practice, and execute worship of select summer events and weekly school year events. Help develop multiple teams to share the opportunity. Communicate, plan, and execute worship with students on the team.

PROGRAM TEAM

The programming team dreams, plans, and executes ways in which the High School Ministry can inspire students to passionately follow Jesus.

Responsibilities: As part of the High School Leadership Team, meet with the team once a month and attend HS Ministry events. The programming team will also meet to plan for the weekly programming needs of the High School Ministry.

MENTOR FOR HS STUDENTS

Help disconnected students grow in personal and spiritual development by providing a consistent, trusting relationship with healthy Christian adults.

Responsibilities: When requested by the High School Ministry team, initiate a relationship with a student and his/her parents. Provide a regular and consistent presence in the life of the student by meeting together or serving together.

Adult men are needed to be a Christ-centered friend to a man as he makes his way through the year-long program. The intention is to model a Christ-centered life journey (not perfect, but Christ-following). Responsibilities: Meet with a man in the spiritual recovery program 1 hour per week for an extended period.

◆ PRAYER PARTNER

Helping Up Mission in downtown Baltimore needs supporters who will pray for the men in the Spiritual Recovery Program, the Overnight Program, and for the overall needs of the Mission. Each week the men submit prayers and praises which are transcribed and distributed to the prayer partners.

◆ PREPARE OR SERVE MEAL

Groups of 6-20 people are needed to serve meals at Helping Up Mission in downtown Baltimore. This is a great way to serve both men who are homeless and men in a residential recovery program struggling to overcome addictions. More than 900 meals a day are served in this spiritual setting! Join the Central group that serves dinner on the first Monday of the month. The Central group meets at 4:15 at the church and returns around 7:30 pm. Anyone who works downtown is welcome to meet the Central group at the mission by 5:00 pm. You can also volunteer to serve lunch or dinner at your own convenience.

◆ PROFESSIONAL VOLUNTEERS

Offering of special skills that support and assist the men at Helping Up Mission (e.g. pastoral counseling, financial literacy, medical services, etc.) Spend some time individually or in class setting offering these skills.

◆ TUTOR

Help men study for their GED exam and/or work on projects to achieve a Maryland High School Diploma. Passing the GED or receiving a diploma can significantly improve job prospects for these men who are struggling to overcome alcohol and drug addictions. Tutor one or more men a few days a week for a period of several weeks to several months. Tutoring hours are 8:00-11:30am Monday-Friday, but a tutoring session can last as little as one hour.

◆ WORSHIP LEADER/MUSICIAN

Lead the Evening Chapel Service at HUM for 50+ overnight guests (and residents who choose to attend the service) by presenting the Gospel message of God's grace and transformative power. Prepare and lead the worship service. This can include music, worship, personal testimonies, pastoral messages, etc.

◆ AIRS VOLUNTEER

Purpose: To mentor, tutor, or teach life skills to the clients at City Steps (AIRS).
